Dear Chairman Cole and Ranking Member DeLauro:

I am requesting funding for the Wild Rice Corridor Habitat Restoration Program in Fiscal Year 2027. The entity to receive funding for this project is the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, located at 441 G St. NW, Washington, DC 20314.

The funding would be used to implement improvements to the Lower Wild Rice Corridor Habitat Restoration Program, which has a long-term purpose to restore a natural corridor area along the Lower Reach of the Wild Rice River. Funding would assist in the restoration of degraded ecosystems through the modification of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' (USACE) project area.

The project is a sound use of taxpayer funds because investing taxpayer dollars in water infrastructure is essential for wildlife health, environmental protection, and water quality. The Lower Wild Rice Corridor Habitat Restoration Program has a long-term purpose to restore a natural corridor area along the Lower Reach of the Wild Rice River. This area was previously straightened by the USACE. This project will reduce bank erosion and sedimentation by stabilizing the river channel which will substantially help meet water quality standards.

The project has a federal nexus because the funding is provided for purposes authorized by Section 1135 of the USACE Program.
